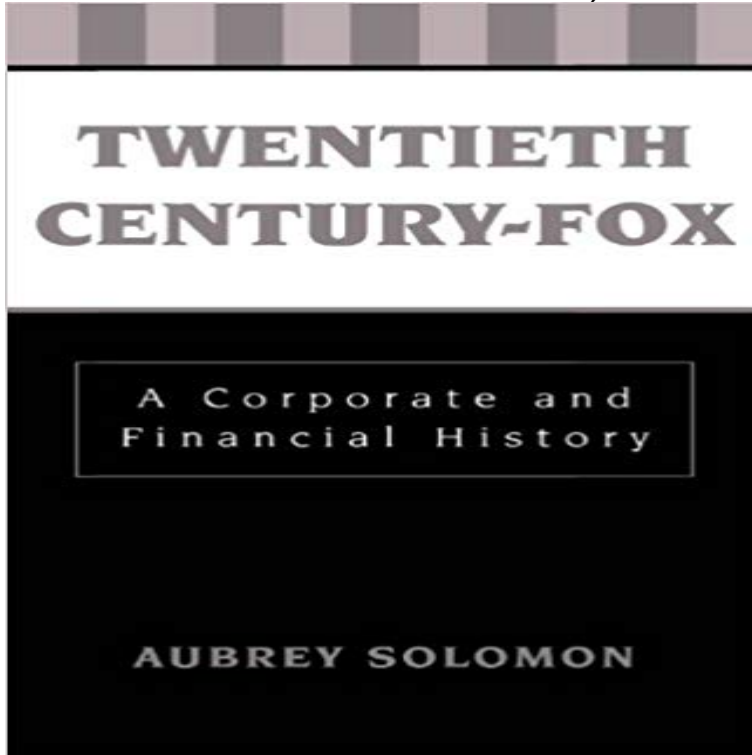


Twentieth Century-Fox: A Corporate and Financial History (The Scarecrow Filmmakers Series)
