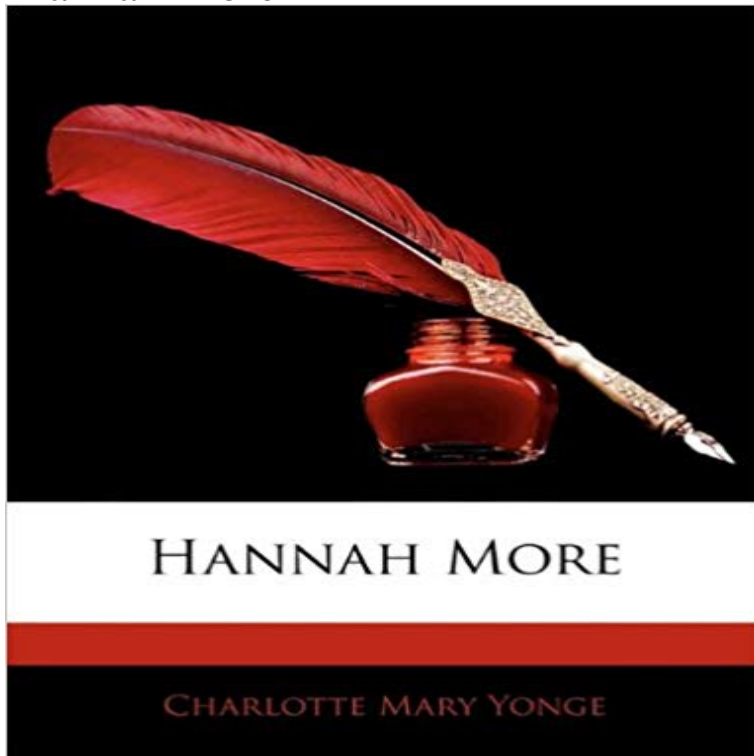


## Hannah More
