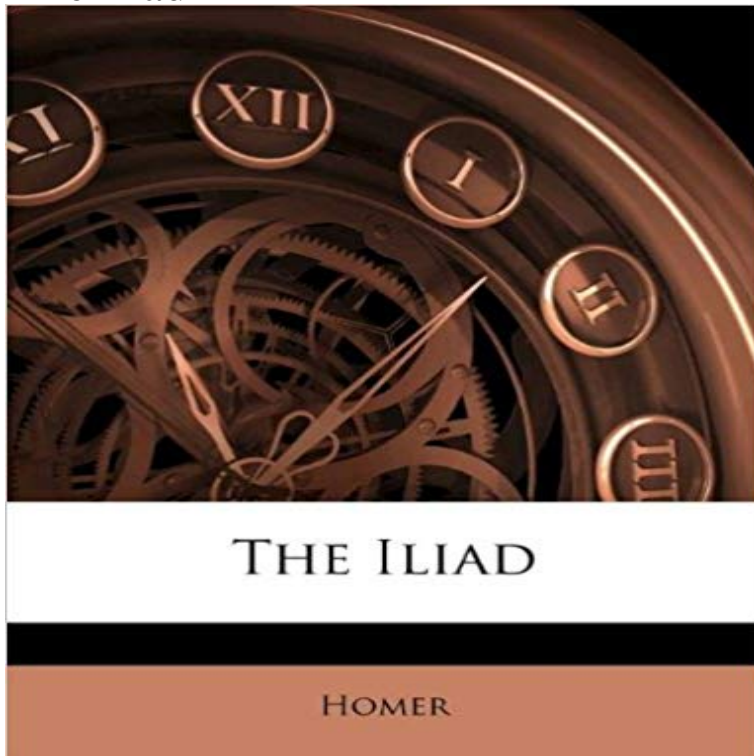


The Iliad
