
Metamorphoses

Rolfe Humphriess faithful blank-verse translation of the originals hexameters shows a definite kinship for Ovids swift and colloquial language, and a poetical manner in tune with the wit and sophistication of the Roman poet. Through Humphriess version, the modern reader will be able to rediscover a major treasury classical mythology which perennially stimulated the imagination.
