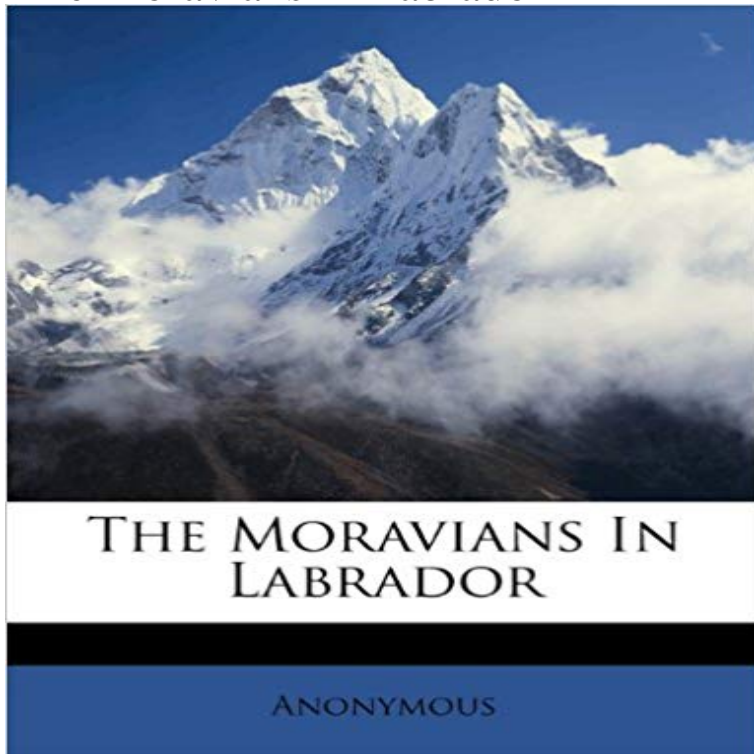


The Moravians In Labrador
