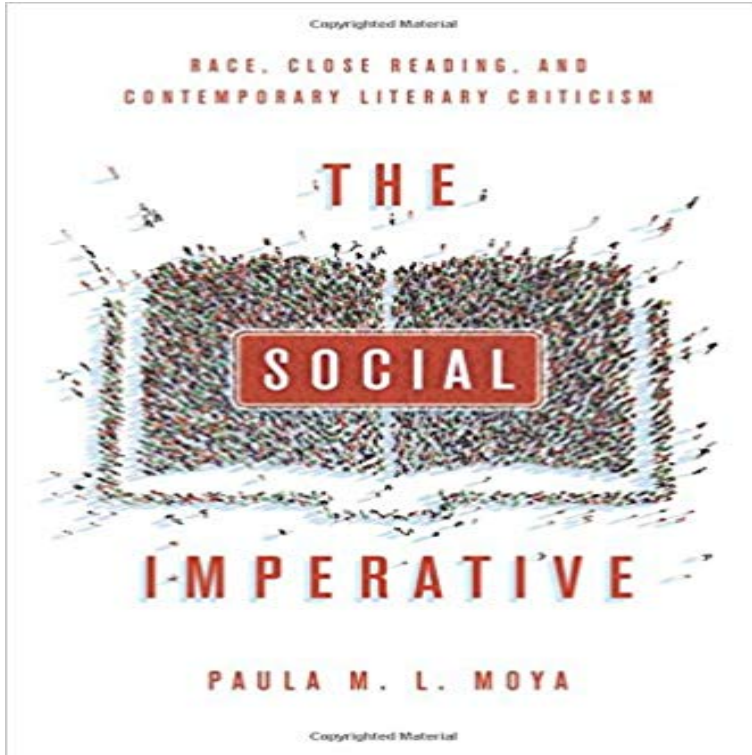


The Social Imperative: Race, Close Reading, and Contemporary Literary Criticism
